A temple dedicated to an outrageous Lama, Drukpa Kunley - Chimi Lhakhang is located on a small hillock hardly 15 kms away from Punakha.

The Chimi Lhakhang Temple is more commonly known as the "Temple of the Divine Madman or Temple of Fertility". There is a sign at the entrance to this Temple that gives a good description of how this Temple got its name: Lam Drukpa Kuenley (1455 to 1570) was an enlightened Buddhist master who personified the true essence of Vajrayana tradition that is also known as "Crazy Wisdom."

Divine Madman Jempel, the Bhutanese cultural guide who came to welcome us at Paro airport, was dressed in Gho or go- the traditional Bhutanese dress worn by men. Gho is a knee-length robe tied at the waist by a cloth belt known as the kera .
