In order to understand the link between observation and science, Quine's naturalized epistemology must be able to identify and describe the process by which scientific knowledge is acquired. One form of this investigation is reliabilismwhich requires that a belief be the product of some reliable method if it is to be considered knowledge.

Quine's project of " naturalized epistemology " is usually interpreted as a rejection of classical epistemology, which becomes merely a "chapter of psychology". It does not imply, however, a different understanding of the character of naturalization is inadequate or wrong.
